



STRUGGLES, STRIFES AND STRESSORS

Every Baylor student's journey is different, but **all** students will face some challenges throughout their time here. As a parent, you can pray for your student's experiences, which may include:

- SEPTEMBER Adjusting to a roommate and newfound homesickness.
- OCTOBER Often a rude awakening! Discovering what it takes to succeed in classes and taking advantage of academic resources such as tutoring, mentoring and mapping out academic courses with an advisor.
- ▶ **NOVEMBER** Balancing late-semester assignments and Finals preparation with Thanksgiving Break and plans for Christmas Break.
- DECEMBER Final exams and trips home for the holidays.
 For freshman students, that first big trip home can be an adjustment after a semester of freedom.

- ► **JANUARY** The start of a new semester and for some students, choosing a sorority or a fraternity.
- FEBRUARY Considering job and internship opportunities and visiting with their academic advisor or making an appointment with the Career Center. For seniors, planning for post-college jobs or post-graduate academic opportunities.
- MARCH Planning a safe and enjoyable Spring Break and coming back ready to re-apply themselves academically.
- ➤ **APRIL** Preparing for Finals, finalizing summer plans and completing important end-of-semester papers and assignments.
- ▶ MAY Final exams, summer vacations, mission trips, jobs, internships, summer classes. However your student spends their summer break, each student is looking to maximize opportunities for growth while also finding needed time to relax and recharge.

ARE YOU FLUENT IN BEAR?

Over the course of the year, your student will likely tell you they are headed to the **SLC** or mention excitement about **Diadeloso**. Baylor student life comes with its own lingo. Here's your cheat sheet to be "in-the-know" when your student drops the latest expression.

Canvas	Baylor's online learning management system where students can check grades, submit assignments, check their assignments, view calendars, etc.
CL	Community Leader, the students responsible for residents in an on-campus residence hall or apartment
Diadeloso	Day of the Bear — a spring campus celebration and day of fun
Dining Dollars	Meal plan dollars to be used at fast casual restaurants on campus
NPE	New Parent Experience
NSE	New Student Experience
OALA	Office of Access and Learning Accommodation
SI	Supplemental Instruction
SLC*	Student Life Center (*pronounced: Slick)
SUB	Short for Student Union Building or the Bill Daniel Student Center (BDSC)



The Paul L. Foster Success Center is home to several departments and programs, all of which share a common goal — helping your student succeed.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT PROGRAMS

- STL 1200 (Strategic Learning) A graded, two-hour course focused on college-level study strategies and selfmanagement skills.
- ► **TUTORING** Available by appointment or walk-in, Monday-Thursday, 9 a.m.-8 p.m., on the first floor of the Sid Richardson Building.
- ▶ MENTORING Meeting once weekly with a more experienced student for encouragement, information, instruction and guidance to help with the transition to the college classroom and campus life.
- ► SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTION (SI) Structured group study sessions conducted twice weekly by a trained peer-leader who has already been successful in the targeted class.



FERPA AND ACCESS TO EDUCATION RECORDS

- ► FERPA is the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974.
- The purpose of FERPA is to provide rights to students with respect to their education records. These rights include:
 - The right to inspect and review the student's educational records
 - The right to request an amendment of the student's educational records.
 - The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's educational records.
 - The right to file with the U.S. Department of Education a complaint regarding an alleged violation under FERPA or its implementing regulations.
- ► At the post-secondary level, the rights provided by FERPA belong to the student regardless of age or dependent status.
- The University is not permitted to disclose education records to parents or other parties without the signed consent of the student (with some limited exceptions).
 - FERPA permits, but does not compel, the University to disclose information from an education record based on signed consent or the limited exceptions to signed consent.
- ➤ The University encourages parents and students to communicate directly with one another regarding student education records and related questions.


Students who live on campus choose from a variety of residential environments that support learning and faith development through relationally driven communities.






IMPORTANT HOUSING INFORMATION

If a student is planning to live on campus for another year, they can start the reapplication process at the end of October.

- Campus Living & Learning will email students their assigned day and time slot to participate in the Choose Your Own Room process based on the number of credit hours each student has earned.
- Students will be asked to agree to the Housing Contract, which secures their space on campus for the next academic year. This is a binding legal document, and is unable to be canceled at a later date.
