ARE YOU FLUENT IN BEAR?

BSB	Baylor Sciences Building
Canvas	Baylor's online learning management system where students can check grades, check and submit assignments, view calendars, etc.
CL	Community Leader, the students responsible for residents in an on-campus residence hall or apartment (other schools may call this an "RA")
Diadeloso	Day of the Bear $-$ an official Baylor holiday and beloved tradition in the spring; a day of no classes and lots of fun!
Dining Dollars	Meal plan dollars to be used at fast casual restaurants on campus
NPE	New Parent Experience
NSE	New Student Experience
OALA	Office of Access and Learning Accommodation
SI	Supplemental Instruction
SLC*	Student Life Center(*pronounced: Slick)
SUB	Student Union Building (the Bill Daniel Student Center)



Academic Support

ACADEMIC ADVISING

- Academic advising is required each semester for all students until at least junior year.
- Students will have at least one academic advisor assigned to them based on major or program.
- Navigate Student app allows students to see their assigned advisor quickly.

OFFICE OF UNDERGRADUATE SUCCESS

- PRE-COLLEGE PROGRAMS Pre-College Programs are designed to support both high-achieving students and those who need additional guidance to succeed.
 - Accelerate and Baylor Dual Credit programs Students start their college transcript while in high school.
 - Baylor Bridge In-person summer courses for students who need more academic support before starting freshman year.
- ▶ PRE-LAW PROGRAM Pre-Law program helps students from all majors explore the possibility of attending law school.
 - Guide students through the application process, prepare them for success in law school and the legal profession.
 - One-on-one professional advising helps Pre-Law students prepare for law school and begin to develop the skills they need to succeed as future lawyers
 - Regular workshops and speakers
 - Connections with lawyer-alumni and internship opportunities give Pre-Law students a realistic understanding of the legal profession.

MAJOR EXPLORATION AND SUCCESS ADVISING (MESA)

 ACADEMIC ADVISING Advisement for the following term's classes is provided each semester for students listed as Undecided/Exploratory majors.

- MAJOR EXPLORATION Advisors are available to schedule discussions for any undergraduate student who is interested in changing majors or who is no longer eligible to remain in their current major.
- ACADEMIC PLANNING Academic advisors assist students as they discover and compare majors, choose courses for future semesters, incorporate co-curricular experiences into their academic plan, and develop realistic goals for careers, professional schools, or other programs beyond their undergraduate experience.
- CLASS SCHEDULE CHANGES Staff can guide Undecided majors about the benefits or disadvantages of adding or dropping certain courses from their schedules.
- DEGREE AUDITS Staff are available to teach exploring students how to run and interpret degree audits for any major so they can clarify and compare requirements.
- MAJORS FAIR Every fall MESA brings together representatives from many academic departments so students can easily ask questions and gather valuable information about majors, minors, and degree programs.

Tutoring, Support, Resources and More

ACADEMIC SUPPORT PROGRAMS

Provides multiple forms of free academic support to help your student develop the academic and personal strategies necessary for success in the Baylor classroom.

► STRATEGIC LEARNING COURSES A study strategies course focusing on the development of strategies for note taking, test preparation test taking, academic resilience and more.



- ▶ **TUTORING** Available by appointment or walk-in, Monday-Thursday, 9 a.m.-8 p.m., on the first floor of the Sid Richardson Building.
- LEARNING LAB Drop in for assistance in enhancing study techniques such as managing time and stress, taking useful notes, creating study tools, setting attainable goals, preparing for tests and achieving academic resiliency.
- MENTORING Meeting once weekly with a more experienced student for encouragement, information, instruction and guidance to help with the transition to the college classroom and campus life.
- NAVIGATE APP offers students a personalized path for success through just in time to-do items, events, appointment making for advising, tutoring and more!
- NEW STUDENT EXPERIENCE (NSE) Combines courses and programs to help students transition to the rigorous academic environment at Baylor.
- STRATEGIC INTERVENTION Provided appropriate academic resources for students facing academic challenges to help them maximize their success.
- SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTION (SI) Structured group study sessions conducted twice weekly by a trained peer-leader who has already been successful in the targeted class.

STUDENT SUPPORT PROGRAMS

Provides programs and supports to increase the connection of students to the Baylor community for all students.

- ► FIRST IN LINE Offers first generation college students programs to maximize success and growth.
- **TRANSFER STUDENT SUCCESS** Provides support, programming and advocacy for transfer students throughout their Baylor experience.
- VETERAN EDUCATIONAL AND TRANSITION SERVICES (VETS) Offers student veterans support, programming and advocacy as they transition to their next chapters of servant leadership.

GRANT AND SPONSORED PROGRAMS

Provides programs and resources to support students at Baylor through research and scholarly opportunities, financial knowledge and skills, and support systems necessary to ensure their educational success on all levels.

- ADELANTE: FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE Equips undergraduate first-year (freshman or transfer) Latino students with the skills, information and support systems needed to identify student services, improve academic performance and graduate from college through mentorship, leadership opportunities, and continuous opportunities for community and civic engagement.
- ADELANTE: BEYOND Programming geared to support 3rd, 4th and 5th year Latinx students with postsecondary completion and successful entry into the workforce by strengthening their skills and leveraging their cultural assets.



- MCNAIR SCHOLARS PROGRAM Prepares low-income, first generation and other underrepresented undergraduate students in acquiring the knowledge, skills and capacities necessary to successfully navigate a path to a Ph.D. program following graduation through immersion in research and a variety of scholarly activities.
- PATHFINDERS Provides undergraduate students in their first year at Baylor with the tools and resources necessary to identify research opportunities and apply for research and graduate preparation programs such as the McNair Scholars Program.
- FINANCIAL WELLNESS Provides values-based money management education, personalized coaching and workshops to empower students for financial stewardship through in-person and online learning opportunities to build knowledge, skills and goals for a lifetime of financial well-being.
- THE STORE Baylor's on-campus food pantry which combats food insecurity by providing fresh and nonperishable food options for students so that every Baylor student has what they need to succeed.
- CAMPUS CLOSET: PROFESSIONAL ATTIRE
 PROGRAM A resource that will provide students who need it, with the ability to apply for one free full professional-wear outfit (blazer, pant, skirt, shirt, etc.) that they can keep and use for interviews as they prepare to enter the job market and graduate school.

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY AND HONOR CODE

Baylor's Honor Code states that all "Baylor University students, staff and faculty shall act in academic matters with the utmost honesty and integrity."

The Office of Academic Integrity has oversight for all records and information related to the Honor Code and academic integrity at Baylor University. It exists to foster student learning and development and academic excellence by promoting a university culture of academic integrity through educational programs, accountability for adherence to university academic integrity policies and assistance for students and faculty in all processes related to academic integrity matters.

FERPA AND ACCESS TO EDUCATION RECORDS

- ▶ FERPA is the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974.
- The purpose of FERPA is to provide rights to students with respect to their education records. These rights include:
 - The right to inspect and review the student's educational records.
 - The right to request an amendment of the student's educational records.
 - The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's educational records.
 - The right to file with the U.S. Department of Education a complaint regarding an alleged violation under FERPA or its implementing regulations.
- At the post-secondary level, the rights provided by FERPA belong to the student regardless of age or dependent status.
- The University is not permitted to disclose education records to parents or other parties without the signed consent of the student (with some limited exceptions).
 - FERPA permits, but does not compel, the University to disclose information from an education record based on signed consent or the limited exceptions to signed consent.
- The University encourages parents and students to communicate directly with one another regarding student education records and related questions.




